#### Second Grade GISD Class Sessions Scheduled

We will once again have several class sessions with the GISD second grade classes during the upcoming school year. The first session will be held on **September 20, 2018** starting at 7:30 am until noon. The children will learn about water cycles and how they work with plants. They will be making several terrariums to learn about how plants use water. David DeMent will be giving the program. Many volunteers will be needed to help with this class session. We are also in need of one gallon clear glass "pickle" jars for this class session. Please drop off in the greenhouse or contact Fran. We need about 40-50 of these jars.

The second session will be held on **November 8**. The students will study insects with Molly Keck, entomologist with Texas A&M AgriLife Extension service in San Antonio, Tx.

The third session will be held **January 31**. The children will be learning about products made from plants.

# **Black Walnut Conservation Program**

This is our fifth year to have the black walnut conservation program. Third grade students from GISD will learn about natural resource conservation and loss of species as a result of the depletion of the

black walnut in Gonzales County. The Guadalupe Black Walnut was once the dominant tree in Gonzales County but it was logged out in the 1880's. A tentative date has been set for **November 28, 2018** with an alternate date of December 5<sup>th</sup> when the students will plant walnut seeds. Stay tuned. Contact Donna Bell if you want to help with this program.

The fourth grade students will help with the distribution of the trees planted last fall (December 2017) when they were 3<sup>rd</sup> graders. The date has not been set. Some of these trees have been promised to the Gonzales Rotary Club to plant at Independence Park in Gonzales. These trees have been maintained by GMG at the "Gonzales Elementary Orchard" located at the south end of the PACE building.
