Gold Star-The member must be at least 15 at the time of application and must have completed at least 3 years in 4-H, including the current year. To be considered you must apply.

JR. MISS AND MR:

This is the highest county awards for 12- & 13-year-old. The winner will be selected from the following items:

A completed record book submitted June 13th
An application due by June 13th
An interview

High school principals and county agents are asked to select (or have a staff or committee select) nominees.
